- Taking appropriate action, including, but not limited to, revocation with respect to State Board-granted and locally-granted charters under specific circumstances set forth in statute.
- Jointly with the State Superintendent, approving districtwide charter petitions when those petitions are determined to be satisfactory.
- Developing and adopting regulations to implement various provisions of the *Charter Schools Act of 1992* (Part 26.8 of the Education Code, commencing with Section 47600).
- Approving or denying requests to waive otherwise applicable provisions of law based upon requests submitted by charter schools and other local education agencies.
- Assigning numbers to charter school petitions to ensure that the statutory cap on the number of charter schools is not exceeded.

The Advisory Commission on Charter Schools will schedule (and amend its schedule for) future meetings as it deems necessary.
